#### Emergency Medical Courses:

**First Aid** - Students learn to recognize and care for a variety of first aid emergencies such as:

- Burns
- Sudden Illnesses
- Cuts
- Head, Neck and Back Injuries
- Scrapes
- Heat and Cold Emergencies

**CPR / AED** - Students learn to respond to breathing and cardiac emergencies to help victims of any age.

#### Requirements:

- Minimum of 5, maximum of 10 participants
- Participants must be 15 years old or older
- Fees must be collected by a congregational liaison prior to class
- Location at a church facility with sufficient space or at a Mount Carmel facility

#### Participant Fees:

- First Aid - \$20
- CPR - \$27
- First Aid with CPR - \$27

## AAA's Senior Driver Improvement Course



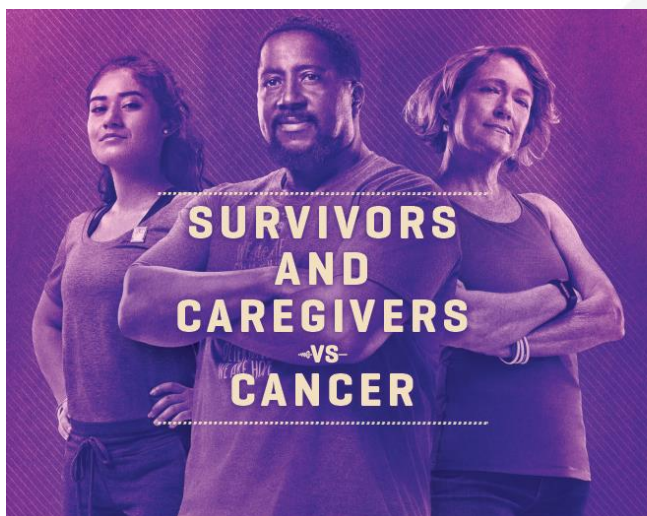



The poverty simulation experience is designed to help participants begin to understand the struggles of low-income families who are trying to survive from month to month.

This poverty simulation is hosted by IMPACT Community Action and the Ohio Community Action Training Organization (OCATO); and will provide unique perspectives as participants assume the roles of low-income family members "living" on a limited budget. These participants will have four 15-minute sessions, each representing one week, in which they will simulate real-life situations that are encountered by those living in poverty.

This experience IS A SIMULATION, NOT A GAME. The objective is to sensitize participants to the realities faced by low-income people.
