

Warwickshire and Coventry All Age Autism Strategy 2021-2026

- Linked to the national strategy published July 2021
- 5 key priorities:
 - 1. Support autistic people and people with social, communication and emotional health needs to help themselves pre and post diagnosis
 - 2. Reduce inequalities for autistic people and make Coventry and Warwickshire autism friendly places to live
 - 3. Develop a range of organisations and services locally with the skills to support autistic people
 - 4. Develop the all age autism specialist support offer (including reducing waiting times for a diagnosis)
 - 5. Co-produce, work together and learn about autism

Written Statement of Action

Outcomes we will strive for:

- The longest waiting times for an autism diagnostic assessment are reduced from 242 weeks to at least 52 weeks
- Children, young people, young adults and their families awaiting a diagnostic assessment can access a clear and coordinated pathway of support that meets their needs
- Following diagnosis of autism, children, young people, young adults and families can access a clear and coordinated offer of support that meets their needs

Outcome: Reduce Waiting Times for Diagnostic Assessment

- Increase capacity for diagnostic assessment and post diagnostic support in the neurodevelopmental service to meet demand
- > Pilot new model to allow straightforward cases to be diagnosed outside specialist services

Outcome: Improve Support for Children, Young People and Adults Awaiting Assessment and/or Post-Diagnosis

Improve the self-help offer

- Online portal linked to the local offer
- More access to videos and online training
- Conferences to bring communities together of families and potential support
- > Recommission the all-age community support service for neurodivergent people to:
 - Introduce a single front door for referrals with enhanced triage for diagnostic service
 - Provide an advice and navigation function
 - Provide low and medium-level support pre and post diagnosis
- Undertake gap-analysis in Speech and Language Therapy and Occupational Therapy Services and look to address any gaps

Outcome: Improve Support for Children, Young People and Adults Awaiting Assessment and/or Post-Diagnosis

- Appropriate and accessible offer within RISE and adult Mental Health provision for autistic children, young people and adults
 - More training for staff on autism
 - More specialist roles with autism expertise
 - Autism champions / peer mentors

Outcome: Support for Children, Young People and Adults Awaiting Assessment and/or Post-Diagnosis (cont.)

There is a need to tackle misconceptions

47% of professionals surveyed said a diagnosis was needed to access an EHC plan

85% of parents who were on the waiting list for an assessment said they wanted a diagnosis to enable them to access adjustments in education

Implement an education-led, stepped approach for multi-agency support for children and young people (including those who are not attending school) to include:

- Training and workforce development into schools
- Clear guidance about tools and strategies
- More guidance/advice from specialists to enable children and young people to stay in school (with or without diagnosis)

Support offer – Pre and post diagnosis

• <u>Community Autism Support Service</u> for children, young people and adults (awaiting an assessment or diagnosed) living in Coventry and Warwickshire, delivered by Coventry and Warwickshire Mind. The service can provide one-to-one support (on referral only), social clubs, peer support groups, and educational sessions.

- <u>Parent Training</u> Act for Autism Children Autism Support Programme (CASP) Parents of autistic children (4-12), residing in Coventry and Warwickshire. Teenager Autism Support Programme (TASP) Parents of autistic teenagers (13-18), residing in Coventry and Warwickshire. Diagnosis not required. Focussed on understanding, supporting and empowering people with autism. Act for Autism use a self-developed training model – the 3Cs Pathway (Connect Calm Communicate) to offer advice on additional support strategies to parents/carers of autistic people.
- <u>**CWPT telephone clinic**</u> 32 hours a week to respond to calls from families on the waiting list. Calls are triaged in the central Navigation Hub (Tel: 0300 200 2021) and where appropriate transferred to a clinician who can offer tailored advice, pre-assessment support and signposting.

- <u>Dimensions Tool</u> (<u>https://cwrise.com/dimensions-tool</u>) it is a web-based app that guides users towards wellbeing support that is specific to individual need. The tool points to relevant advice, support, and local interventions after users have answered a series of multiple-choice questions related to their individuals circumstances.
- <u>Coventry and Warwickshire CAMHS and Rise</u> Rise is a family of NHS-led services providing emotional wellbeing and mental health services for children and young people in Coventry and Warwickshire, and includes:

- <u>Kooth</u> A digital mental health platform (not autism specific) that provides a confidential, anonymous space for all young people aged 11 - 25 years old who are worried about their MH or are experiencing MH issues. Kooth offers free, immediate, online counselling as well as access to lots of self-help tools such as; discussion forums with peers, an online magazine and even an activity hub of challenges.
- SENDIAS (Special Education Needs Information Advice and Support Services) supports parents and carers of children with special educational needs and disabilities, from 0 25 years of age. It is a free, confidential and impartial service that offers independent support for parents and families who have children and young people with a SEND, as well as provision of independent advice directly to children (0-15yo) and young peoples (16 to 25yo) with a SEND.
