Year 9 Bronze DofE Award (Training Activities)

I am writing to remind you that the DofE training activities will take place soon. Activities will take place **outside** – **in rain or shine**. Good quality waterproofs, suitable footwear and a sense of adventure are therefore compulsory on both days! Activities will be led by WayAhead Training and a male and female member of staff from Toot Hill School will be available to provide pastoral support, as necessary.

Training Day 1: Friday 24th March 2023

Theme: Development of Navigation and Map Reading Skills.

Activities: A day expedition in the Vale of Belvoir with navigation and map reading activities led

by qualified leaders from WayAhead Training.

Arrival: Come to school, register with your tutor, then meet at the bus park at 08:45.

Kit: Non-School Uniform.

Wear appropriate and comfortable outdoor clothing that is **suitable for a day walk** and the **weather conditions** on the day (no tracksuit bottoms). This may include warm hats, gloves and sun cream! Good quality waterproofs, sturdy (walked in)

walking boots and a secure day rucksack are essential.

Lunch: Bring a packed lunch, high energy snacks and plenty of fluid. (please no nuts).
Departure: Pupils will be dismissed at 2:10 and will use their normal mode of transport home.

Training Day 2: Saturday 25th March 2023

Theme: Campcraft, Cooking on Expedition, Rucksack Packing and First Aid Skills.

• Activities: Groups will undertake a carousel of challenging activities to help improve their ability

to survive and thrive in the field.

• Arrival: Register outside the entrance to **Toot Hill College** at 08:25.

Kit: as above.Lunch: as above.

Departure: Pupils will be dismissed from the Leisure Centre Car Park at 2:10 pm.

Toot Hill School DofE Behavior Contract

Everybody taking part in DofE deserves the right to enjoy a positive experience and to take away new skills and fond memories. All pupils are required to comply with this behavior contract which is underpinned by our ethos of **Work Hard – Be Kind – Take Pride**. Normal whole school behavior and safeguarding policies apply, however in addition please see below.

Please read this document carefully with your child and give your consent by checking the appropriate box on the consent form.

By signing this contract, you agree to:

1. Behave responsibly and respect others

Be kind, show respect and consider the feelings and needs of others. Treat others fairly and do not behave inappropriately. Act responsibly and consider everyone's safety during activities. Be respectful of other participant's privacy when using social media and digital technology.

2. Do not bring or use alcohol, cigarettes, e-cigarettes or illegal substances

Anyone bringing, found to be in possession of or using the above will immediately be removed from the programme and collected by parents/guardians. Disciplinary action will be taken involving the police, as appropriate.

3. Mobile Phones & Electronic Devices

We strongly advise pupils not to bring valuable items and we will not be liable for any loss or damage to mobile phones etc. Any phone brought will be intended for emergency purposes only and must be used responsibly and with due consideration for the privacy of others, especially with regards to social media and the sharing or publishing of photographs to websites or social media. Any device brought must be switched off and placed in a waterproof bag within participant's rucksacks. Mobile speakers are **not** permitted.

4. Attend for the full duration of the DofE Award

DofE involves multiple commitments, from the skill, physical and volunteering activities to the training activities and qualifying expeditions. All pupils are expected to complete all aspects of the program.

5. Respect the Accommodation Rules

Tents are single sex and everyone must respect the privacy of others at all times.

6. Abide by health and safety rules

You must abide by all health and safety instructions at all times. Anyone refusing to abide by health and safety instructions may be removed from the programme.

7. Follow the Countryside Code

It is very important that all pupils are respectful when out on expedition. All litter must be carried and disposed of responsibly. Pupils should be aware of their impact on the environment and limit it at all times.

8. Respect all property

A financial contribution for the repair or replacement of equipment (up to full cost) may be made for any damage caused. Criminal damage, theft and vandalism will be reported to parents/guardians/carers and the police, if necessary.

9. Respect others' possessions

You should respect other people's possessions and ensure that you keep your own possessions safe. We take no responsibility for lost or stolen personal possessions. <u>Do not</u> bring valuable items with you.

10. Notify staff if you feel unwell

You should advise a member of staff promptly if you feel unwell. Parents/Guardians/Carers must supply a 24-hour emergency contact number where they can be reached in such an event and be prepared to collect their child should they need to return home.

11. Remain at the campsite

Leaving the campsite without permission is strictly forbidden.

12. Listen and act on instructions from all staff

You must listen and act on any reasonable instruction given to you by staff. This includes but is not limited to Toot Hill School staff, WayAhead Training leaders and campsite staff.

13. Wear appropriate clothing

Practical, appropriate clothing and footwear, suitable for the weather conditions, must be worn at all times.

14. Respect and adhere to curfew times during the camping trips

DofE is a physically challenging activity. During the expeditions, DofE participants should adhere to the curfew times and respect the wishes of fellow participants wishing to rest in preparation for the next day's activities.

15. Take care of own daily medication

Participants taking routine medication should inform their team leader and ensure it is to hand at all times. If medication requires specialist administration and/or storage, parents must make Toot Hill School aware at the earliest opportunity via the electronic EV4 medical form which must be completed before each expedition.

The above requirements have been set by Toot Hill School. Pupils will have the opportunity to work in their teams alongside their leaders to discuss their own set of guidelines and personal expectations during the programme. Through our pupil voice program, our DofE Ambassadors have assessed this behavior policy and have had the opportunity to influence its content.

Appendix 2.

Ideas to help you to support your child during their DofE journey





1. Encourage your child to stay focused on their Skill, Volunteering and Physical activities

Most pupils have now started their activities and have updated eDofE with all the necessary details. If you are still looking for ideas you can download a very useful resource here: www.dofe.org/do/ideas/. In our experience promptly starting activities and completing eDofE increases the likelihood that pupils with promptly graduate with their full DofE Award. We therefore encourage all pupils to start asap and remain focused on their objectives.

2. Encourage your child to collect evidence of their activities and make a DofE Log

Your child should be collecting evidence that can be used to show their assessor what they have been doing. Evidence can take the form of photos or written evidence uploaded to eDofE. They can record their activities on a DofE Log sheet. Download a DofE Log here: https://www.dofe.org/do/activitylogs/. Your child should upload this document to eDofE when they have finished the required timescale — it does https://www.dofe.org/do/activitylogs/. 3. Download a copy of the DofE Welcome Pack

If for any reason your welcome pack hasn't arrived, or you require a copy, you can download a digital version from here: https://www.dofe.org/welcome-packs-dth/.

4. Complete Assessor Reports and Upload to eDofE

Once your child has completed the required timescale for an activity they should ask their assessor to complete an assessor's report. You can use the card that is included in the DofE Welcome Pack or the digital version which can be found here: https://www.dofe.org/assessor/ – both methods are fine but the electronic option is generally quicker and easier to administer.

5. Familiarize yourself with the expedition and payment instalment dates

Appendix 3, provides a reminder of the dates and locations for the training days and qualifying expeditions. It also provides details of the deadlines for the next payment instalments.
